Reports were read: Treasurer's Report, we made \$1,256.20 on our 2017 Muster. We ended the year with \$13,863.30 in the bank. This was a net gain of \$1,979.49 for the year. Secretary's Report, we had 5 meetings, 5 breakfast gatherings, we held a Flea Market, participated in the St. Patty's Parade, Emergency Responders Night at the Revs, spent 3 days with the Clysdales, attended the Blueberry Festival at Brown's, National Truck Show Carlisle, we were a vendor at 7 Musters, held our own York Fire Muster on 10-1-2017, held a Picnic and a Christmas Party. Membership Report, we ended 2017 with 14 Life Member; 5 new for the year, 54 Active Members; 19 new for the year, and 1 Organization Member for a total of 68 paying members. Station of the Quarter

Our station for this quarter is the Alert Fire Company No. 1, Emigsville, PA. They are celebrating their 100th Anniversity in 2018. With a motto of "We Aim To Protect" they were formed on January 21, 1918 in the home of insurance agent, Charles Roland. Originally know as the Emigsville Fire Company the name was changed to Alert Fire Company No. 1 on August 2, 1918. This change was because they realized that their response area was greater then the Village of Emigsville. The first truck was purchased in Aug. 1919 and it was a Model T Ford Truck equipped with 2 forty-gallon tanks and it arrived on Oct. 3, 1919 and housed in A.E. Baker's garage. The first Firehouse was opened on Jan. 1, 1921 with a Parade and a New Year's Eve dance. In 1927 an order for a new fire truck was placed with Reo Speed Wagon to replace the Model T Ford. Many different engines were purchased over the next 25 years. In 1951 a Ward LaFrance was elected Fire Chief and in 1957 a GMC Tanker was ordered. In 1964 a new Ward LaFrance triple combination pumper was ordered. KFO 851 went on the air. A new tanker, a 1966 Ford Ward LaFrance was ordered. In July 1966 Alert hire two professional Fire Engineers and Paul Schaefer as it's first professional Fire Chief. This was the start and the first 4 decades of the Alert Fire Company No. 1.






